*I work in the fields of art, philosophy and politics by whatever means necessary. The results are usually some kind of visual art, literature, theatre, film or theory. For me art is the most flexible, versatile and holistic form of philosophy and politics.*

*I've had 51 solo exhibitions and participated in over 200 group shows. I've written seven books. And I've written six and directed seven plays for theatre.*
